### Charging points for electric cars in Chepstow

The Energy Group has been in contact with Monmouthshire County Council about provision of car charging points in town car parks. Gwent Energy has made a proposal to install 2 points near to the library in Chepstow car park. This scheme can be extended to any building with a power connection, parking space, and a means of collecting the charging fee. The proposal includes sourcing renewable power from one of their solar farms. Gwent Energy CIC is now an accredited car charge point installer.
